Project Description

- We are proud of achieving an excellent gender balance, often 50%/50% at an attendance of consistently around 20
- Our speakers are equally varied and cover diverse topics such as career advice from inside and outside of academia, covering science, work & life, careers, outreach, research culture, policy, science, mentors and role models, industry, academia, public engagement and much more.
- Our format is the following: we meet every other week for 1h in the library at 12pm, where lunch, tea and coffee is provided. We chat, eat and catch up with each other before our guest speaker takes the floor for a 30 min informal presentation or chat. Afterwards we open the table for discussion and banter.
